Installation Instructions

SPECIFICATIONS

- Fits 2007-2019 Toyota Tundra w/ 6'5" bed
 - Double Cab ONLY
- Kit contains Universal Rails with Custom Mounting Brackets
 - Hitch is located center of axle

IMPORTANT

DO NOT OPERATE HITCH UNTIL YOU READ THIS SECTION!

- 1. The SuperGlide hitch was designed to allow the Turntable Cam Arm Assembly to "glide" along two metal tubes, called the Way Tubes. Since it's release in 1998, we have made several advancements in the design, strength, and durability of these components. The Lubrication section of your Owners Manual spans several product releases and design changes. It is *imperative* that you read each section and determine which SuperGlide hitch you purchased, and how to care for it. There have been three major lubrication changes to the SuperGlide hitch:
 - Prior to April 2008, Way Tubes were assembled with either a conventional, quality grade grease or none at all
 - In April 2008, we started coating the Way Tubes with a graphite-based spray lubricant called SlipPlate™
 - November 2009 brings a new innovation from PullRite Towing Systems with the use of plastics. The Turntable Cam Arm Assembly is now equipped with Plastic Wear Plates; see Owners Manual for details (not available for #3600 models)

Depending on when your hitch was manufactured, the Way Tubes of your new SuperGlide hitch will meet one of the above criteria. Each application listed requires some level of maintenance, so it is important that you read the following instructions carefully for the correct lubrication instructions.

Failure to properly lubricate the Way Tubes, as directed in this section, will eventually cause galling between the metals of the Way Tubes and Cam Arm Assembly, which will result in hitch failure.

Destruction of various hitch parts is also likely, as well as truck and/or trailer damage, and will not be covered under the Manufacturer's Warranty.

- 2. THE TRAILER'S KING PIN BOX MUST BE EQUIPPED WITH A CAPTURE PLATE (UNIVERSAL OR QUICK CONNECT) TO ALLOW THE HITCH TO FUNCTION (MUST BE PURCHASED SEPARATELY). NOTE: IF YOU HAVE PURCHASED A QUICK CONNECT CAPTURE PLATE AND DID NOT RECEIVE INSTRUCTIONS, THEY ARE AVAILABLE ONLINE, OR YOU CAN CONTACT PULLRITE CUSTOMER SERVICE AT (800) 443-2307.
- 3. Failure to modify the length of the brake away cable that activates the emergency braking of your trailer, may cause the cable to catch on protruding parts of the hitch. Resulting damage will not be covered by the manufacturers warranty.
- 4. There should be a minimum of 6" between the truck bed rails and the under side of the trailer for side tilt clearance. It is the customers responsibility to adjust the trailer king pin box for the appropriate amount of clearance.
 - **NOTE**: Some truck models are being manufactured with higher bed sides, making it necessary to adjust the height of your trailer's king pin box. If you don't have enough height adjustment available, PullRite produces a 3" Lift Kit that attaches to the rails of your #3100 (ask for part #3108) or #4100, #3300 and #4400 (ask for part #4408) SuperGlide models.
- 5. Some truck beds have contoured bed sides, making the inside bed measurement narrower. Make certain the trailer's king pin box does not contact the inside edge of the bed.
- 6. Trucks with bed liners may need a tall Mounting Post. See "NOTE" under "Drilling the Bed" for further details.
- 7. It is the installers and customers responsibility to ensure there is proper clearance between the truck and trailer. There should be a minimum of 2" of clearance as the trailer passes the cab. Call PullRite technical support with trailer width, make and year of truck and distance the king pin is from leading edge of the trailer (See "Caution" section, in the SuperGlide Owners Manual, for measuring procedure) at (800) 443-2307.
- 8. Read these instructions completely and follow them accurately. Should you have any questions, please call Customer Service at (800) 443-2307 prior to installation for assistance. *If you did not recieve your Owners Manual, visit us online at www.pullrite.com or call the number above.*
- 9. The SuperGlide was designed for short bed pickup trucks. The hitch may function in a longer bed truck, but no mounting brackets exist to make the transfer. Some #4100 and #4400 mounting kits may transfer with modification.

#3100 SuperGlide Applications

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UNIVERSAL CAPTURE PLATE INSTALLATION

The following instructions should be followed to install the Universal Capture Plate. Note: If more information is needed, please call PullRite at (800) 443-2307.

NOTE: Quick Connect Capture Plates are available for various king pin box sizes. Contact the Customer Service Dept. at PullRite for further assistance.

NOTE: 10 bolts are required to fasten the Universal Capture Plate. Make certain they are positioned so the front row of holes have at least 2 to 3 fasteners, the rear row of holes has 2 fasteners and each outside row of holes has 2 to 3 as well. Fill in around the kin pin. If you are not able to bolt into the outside perimeter, you will need to weld on extensions to the king pin plate, both front and rear. See instructions for "King Pin Boxes That Are Shorter Front to Back."

I. FOR KING PIN BOXES WITH A FLANGE: (Figure 3)

- 1. Place the Capture Plate over the king pin, with the guide wedge towards the rear of the trailer (wedge facing down). Align the Capture Plate square with the king pin box and clamp in place to prevent movement.
- 2. Mark the holes for drilling through the Capture Plate onto the king pin box flange.
- 3. Remove the Capture Plate or use it as a guide and drill $\frac{1}{4}$ " holes through the flange.
- 4. Re-install the Capture Plate (as in step 1).
- 5. Use the ¼" bolts provided, to secure the Capture Plate onto the king pin box flange. A <u>minimum of 10 bolts</u> must be used to fasten the plate on. These fasteners do not count as part of the minimum number of bolts required. Make certain all the bolts are <u>flush with the trailer plate</u>. Fasteners that are installed at an angle catch and "drag" on the 5th wheel plate surface, weakening the integrity of the fastener.
- 6. If the Capture Plate extends beyond the king pin box, then install the braces {K2-K4} as shown in Figure 4. These fasteners do not count as part of the minimum number of bolts required.



II. FOR KING PIN BOXES WITHOUT FLANGES: (Figure 4)

- 1. Place the Capture Plate {J2} over the king pin, with the guide wedge towards the rear of the trailer (wedge facing down), and hold in place to prevent movement.
- 2. The Capture Plate can be secured to the king pin box sides by welding angle iron supports to the king pin box, or use the extension plate in Section III on the following page. (Angle iron is not provided).
- 3. For the holes where you cannot reach the inside nose of the king pin box, drill holes with a #8 drill and tap with a ¼"-20 tap.
- 4. If the Capture Plate extends beyond the king pin box, then install the knee braces as shown in Figure 4.
- 5. Use the ¼" bolts provided, to secure the Capture Plate onto the king pin box flange. A <u>minimum of 10 bolts</u> must be used to fasten the plate on. These fasteners do not count as part of the minimum number of bolts required. Make certain all the bolts



are <u>flush with the trailer plate</u>. Fasteners that are installed at an angle catch and "drag" on the 5th wheel plate surface, weakening the integrity of the fastener.

UNIVERSAL CAPTURE PLATE INSTALLATION (cont.)

III. FOR KING PIN BOXES THAT ARE SHORTER FRONT TO BACK:

1. Place the Capture Plate over the king pin, with the guide wedge towards the rear of the trailer (wedge facing down), and measure the distance from the front and rear of the king pin box to the respective edges of the Capture Plate (to the bend of the Capture Plate in the front). Referring to Figure 5, suing the supplied extension plates, fasten plates to the front and back row of holes using the 1/4" bolts and lock nuts provided.

CAUTION: The provided extension plates are universal and must be trimmed to fit your specific application. When extensions are installed, the capture plate adapter (#3317) should be <u>flush</u> against eh bottom of the trailer's king pin plate.

- 2. While the trailer plate is in position under the king pin box, clamp these plates to both the front and rear of the Capture Plate. Remove the Capture Plate and drill matching holes in the two support plates with a 1/4" bit using the Capture Plate as a guide.
- 3. Fasten the two support plates to the Capture Plate with the 1/4" Bolts {K7} and Lock Nuts {K8} provided.
- 4. Replace the Capture Plate on the king pin box, check for square alignment and <u>weld</u> the extension plates to the king pin box.
- 5. Attach the Knee Braces {K2,3 & 4} to the king pin box and the Capture Plate. Braces {K2} may have to be welded on if the interior of the king pin box is not accessible.
- 6. See Figure 5 below for diagram and special notes.




INSTALLATION TIP:

The template has a tendency to move when placed on the slick paint of new truck beds, and it may be helpful to place a small piece of NON-SKID matting, such as "SCOOT-GARD" ™, to help keep the template from moving.



MOUNTING BRACKET INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Verify the part numbers listed on the shipping carton and check part quantities using the Parts List on page 11.
- 2. Remove the spare tire.
- 3. Layout the bed according to the layout or template method drawing on the previous page, marking each hole carefully.
- 4. Cover each slotted hole on the top flange of each mounting bracket with transparent tape.
- 5. On the rear driver side, remove and retain the front bolts on the factory hitch receiver bracket. See Installation Photo #3 on page 9.

- 6. Slide the rear driver side bracket (#442003) between the frame and the factory hitch receiver bracket.
- 7. On the rear passenger side, remove the front two bolts on the factory hitch receiver bracket, and loosen the rear bolts to allow the mounting bracket (#442004) to slide more easily past the shock tower.
- 8. Loosely reinstall the factory bolts removed on Steps 4 and 6.

CAUTION: Fuel pump is located below the front driver side mounting bracket. Use extreme caution or simply remove the fuel pump prior to drilling the bed and frame holes.


- 8. Clamp the front brackets to the frame. Position as seen in the figure on Page 7 and on Installation Photos 1 and 2 on Page 8.
- 9. Using the **marked** holes in the Bed Layout as a guide, drill a 1/16" hole through the bed beginning with the driver side front holes.
- 10. When the pilot hole is drilled through the bed, the transparent tape will be pierced by the small drill. It should be centered front-to-back of the bracket's slotted hole.
- 11. Drill each of the marked hole locations, preferably using a step drill of at least 3/4" diameter. (A step drill is a cone shaped bit that has a variety of gradually larger diameter sizes the deeper the drill is used). The 3/4" holes will be covered by the Base Rails and will make the installation easier than if a 1/2" hole is used.

MOUNTING BRACKET INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS (CONT.)


- 12. Place the hitch, with the Base Rails attached, over the top of the drilled holes after removing the drill shavings from the bed and treating the holes with a suitable rust inhibitor.
- 13. Insert a 1/2"-13 x 2" Hex Bolt through each bed hole.
- 14. Fasten the Base Rails and Mounting Brackets to the bed using Bed Shims to fill the bed channel (Bed Shims keep the bed channels from collapsing when the bolts are tightened), Flat Washers and Flange Nuts. (See Page 10 for placement of Bed Shims).
- 15. Fasten the Base Rails to the bed using the four Offset Hole Back Up Plates. (See Page 10).
- 16. Tighten all Base Rail / Bed bolts to 75 foot pounds.

NOTE: Before drilling, check the inside of the frame to guard against drilling into the fuel tank, wiring, brake lines or fuel module.

- 17. Drill 1/2" holes in the frame for each Front Mounting Bracket using the pre-punched holes in the mounting bracket as a guide and insert the 1/2" Frame Bolts to fasten.
- 18. Tighten the Mounting Brackets to 75 foot pounds.




Side View of Installation Driver's Side

(View of Driver Side Front Mounting Bracket positioned over existing frame bolt)




Installation Photo #2 (Side View of above)




Installation Photo #3

frame and existing receiver hitch bracket using original factory mounting bolts)


EXPLODED VIEW
